FDA's New Plan to Combat Tobacco's Public Health Toll

Despite significant progress since the landmark 1964 Surgeon General's Report on Smoking and Health, cigarette smoking remains the number one cause of preventable disease and death in the United States, killing 480,000 Americans each year. About 87% of deaths resulting from lung cancer and 32% of deaths resulting from coronary heart disease in this country have been attributed to cigarette smoking.
